

American Center Organizes Program to Counter Human Trafficking

To mark National Slavery and Human Trafficking Prevention Month, American Center organized a total of five interactive programs on prevention of human trafficking. One among them was led by Chet Narayan Rasaili, a human rights activist and USG exchange alum. Over 50 enthusiastic and interactive undergraduate and graduate students comprised the audience, mostly from the fields of law and social sciences. Discussions included crucial topics such as the concept of human rights, human rights instruments, and the issues of slavery and human trafficking in the context of Nepal. A group activity followed the session and included discussions on preventing human trafficking, formulating and amending laws on human trafficking, and combating human trafficking as a youth.

January Program Highlights

American Center Honors Martin Luther King, Jr.

To mark the Martin Luther King (MLK) Jr. Day, American Center on Jan. 16th organized an interactive program led by American Center Director Sulav Bhatta who discussed the life and contributions of MLK to end racial discrimination in the U.S. The audience consisted of more than 40 interactive participants who watched Kanopy compilations of major historical speeches given by MLK. They learned how MLK dedicated his life to nonviolence for racial equality and his contributions to pass the Civil Rights of 1964 and the Voting Rights Act of 1965. Mr. Bhatta talked about MLK's struggles for equality leading up to the passage of these laws. Furthermore, he compared MLK's struggles with similar fights to end oppression in Nepal, including the fights against caste, gender, and ethnicity-based discrimination.
